Virginia Beach native Elizabeth Koeppen began her training with Judith Hatcher and Darlene Kelly. Since then she has never stopped making waves in the dance world. Liz received her BFA studying at SUNY Purchase's rigorous Dance Program. In 1989, she joined Parsons Dance Company as a young performer.

Today, she is the company's Associate Director, where she shares responsiblity with David Parsons for running the day-to-day activities, while staging

works and touring.

"The transition from dancer to Associate Director has been very smooth. Over 17 years, I've experienced the highs of performing David's incredible works, around the world; then as rehearsal director, building on his innovative talent. I've been very lucky."

It's much more than luck, though. Through Liz's hard work and commitment, she's had the opportunity to stage David Parsons' works with a number of great companies including the New York City Ballet, Penn-

sylvania Ballet, Les Ballets Jazz de Montreal, and Roland Petit's Ballet National de Marseille.

She's also an experienced teacher, not only at her alma mater, but well-regarded institutions like The Juilliard School, NYU's Tisch School, and The 92nd Street Y.

Of course, Liz misses being on stage - any dancer would - but

the dance world is more than performing. Through hard work and her own innate ambition, she's been able to create a gratifying career off-stage as a teacher, coach and rehearsal director.

When we contracted with Parsons Dance to perform The Envelope, Liz was sent as rehearsal

director. Her experiences with our dancers simply reaffirmed her confidence in the Ensemble.

"It's been a wonderful addition to my career - and my life working with these talented, beautifully trained and nurtured dancers. While teaching them The Envelope, I was absolutely surprised at their concentration and desire to learn the piece. Their hard work, and professionalism helped them master a very complicated style in a very short time.
